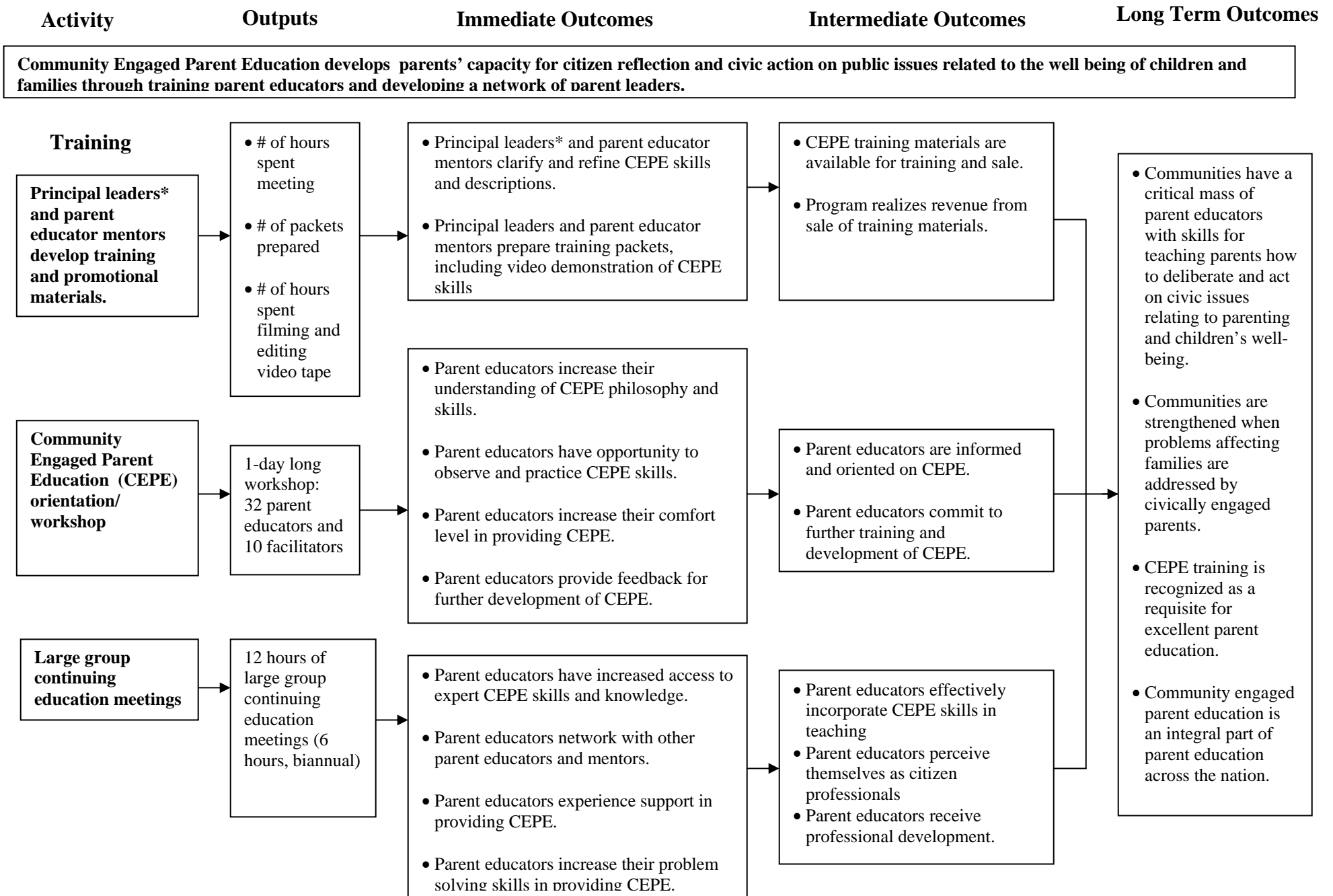
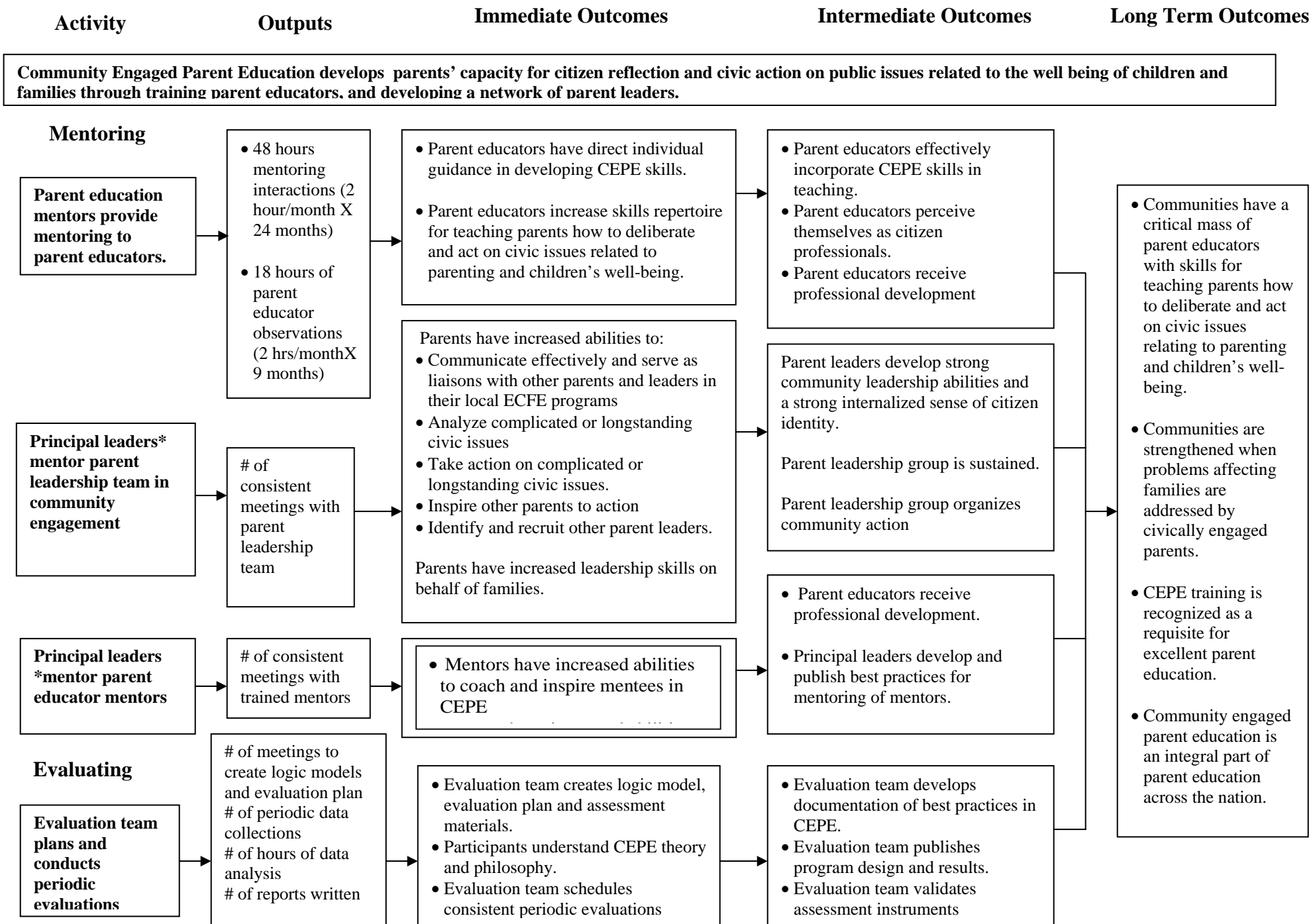


Community Engaged Parent Education Logic Model

Community Engaged Parent Education develops parents' capacity for reflection and civic action on public issues related to the well being of children and families through training parent educators and developing a network of parent leaders.

Activities on page 1 support:



Plan and conduct classes from a CEPE model

6300 parents receive 64 hours each of guided informational and experiential instruction.

Parent educators identify parent leaders (12-15 parents) for further mentoring in community engagement.

Parent educators develop increased ability to:

- Make families and community an explicit core content area.
- Weave public dimensions of parenting into the discussion of personal parenting concerns.
- Emphasize the importance of citizen dialog by naming and exploring a community problem in class.
- Offer data and resources on public issues
- Facilitate collective action on issues that are of concern to parents.

Parents develop increased abilities to:

- Think and converse about the public dimensions of parenting issues.
- Access parent educators with skills for deliberating and acting on civic issues.
- Seek connections between public and private actions of parenting.
- Understand community forces and institutions that affect their children.
- Analyze the roles of various community stakeholders.
- Understand power and conflict in communities.

• Parents develop strong sense of citizen identity
• Parents deliberate and act on civic issues.

• Communities have a critical mass of parent educators with skills for teaching parents how to deliberate and act on civic issues relating to parenting and children's well-being.

• Communities are strengthened when problems affecting families are addressed by civically engaged parents.

• CEPE training is recognized as requisite for excellent parent education.

• Community engaged parent education is an integral part of parent education across the nation.
