

Application for Admission to Additional Licensure Programs

The attached application form must be completed by applicants to additional licensure programs offered by the College of Education and Human Development (CEHD). These are teaching or administrative licenses added to a current five-year, full-time professional Minnesota license.

Applicants who are seeking admission to an additional licensure program for the purpose of contract renewal with a school district should pay careful attention to the review schedule on the next page of this application.

This application may be submitted in conjunction with a CEHD Application for Admission to Master of Education (M.Ed.)/Professional Studies Programs. Applicants seeking both credentials (M.Ed. degree and additional license) must submit both applications.

Obtaining Additional Licensure

■ What is an additional license?

An additional license is a teaching or administrative license added to an existing initial Minnesota license.

■ Who can get an additional license?

Any Minnesota licensed teacher wanting to add a new field or scope to their existing license may be eligible for an additional license. Candidates may work on an additional licensure program while simultaneously pursuing a master of education (M.Ed.) degree. The following examples offer a general idea of the licenses you may add through an additional licensure program:

Elementary licensed teachers (grades K-6 or 1-6) may add a middle school license (5-8) in a selected specialty area.

Secondary licensed teachers (7-12) may add a middle school license (5-8) in their current and/or additional specialty area.

Secondary licensed teachers (7-12) may add a new secondary specialty area (5-12).

Additional licenses are also available in special education, English as a Second Language (ESL), and 14 world languages.

Applicants with licenses from states other than Minnesota:

In order to qualify for an additional license, candidates must first obtain licensure in Minnesota. If you have a teaching license from another state and wish to obtain a Minnesota license, contact the Minnesota Department of Education (MDE), 651-582-8200; e-mail: Personnel.Licensing@state.mn.us. ■ What is the process for obtaining an additional license?

Once you have submitted the required application materials for an additional license, faculty and advisers will review your materials and respond to you with a customized program, including content, content methods, and clinical experience requirements. Licensure requirements are set by the Minnesota Board of Teaching and are subject to change. Your credentials may need to be reevaluated before completion of your additional licensure program.

Note: Most persons applying for an additional Minnesota teaching license in a new content area will be required to pass Praxis II: Subject Assessments, a state-mandated teacher assessment test administered by Educational Testing Service (ETS). Application Package

Applicants to additional licensure programs must submit the following items:

1. CEHD additional licensure application form (attached to this packet or on the Web: <http://cehd.umn.edu/students/Forms/App-add-lic.pdf>)
2. Application fee: Make check, money order, or bank draft payable to the University of Minnesota in the amount of \$55.00 for up to two licensure areas. To apply to more than two licensure areas, add a \$25.00 application fee for each program. The fees do not apply to current M.Ed. students or current M.Ed. applicants or to those who have completed the M.Ed. at the University of Minnesota within the past three years.
Kindergarten applicants: These applicants are exempt from the application fee.
3. Official transcripts from all undergraduate or graduate colleges or universities where you completed coursework applicable to the licensure you are seeking, except the University of Minnesota. Official transcripts must be received from the issuing school in a sealed and stamped envelope. The application process includes a review of the applicant's grade point average (GPA).
4. Professional résumé
Adult basic education applicants: These applicants are not required to submit a résumé.
5. If applicable, a copy of your current or previous Minnesota teaching license(s)
6. Educational goal statement. Required for applicants to the English as a Second Language (ESL) program; optional for others. Submit a one-two paragraph statement if you wish to clarify or add information to your application.

Any student with a U.S. bachelor's degree or a comparable foreign degree from an accredited college or university may apply to CEHD. Official transcripts of all previous post-secondary academic study must be submitted.

Special education applicants: In addition to the items listed above, applicants must submit supplemental application materials. For more details, see the "Special Education Programs" section in the following text.

Special education programs

This additional licensure application is intended for students seeking additional licensure in another special education area (e.g., learning disabilities). These applicants must hold a current Minnesota teaching license in at least one special education area and hold a master of education (M.Ed.) degree from the University of Minnesota's special education program.

Other applicants pursuing special education licensure must submit the separate CEHD Application for Admission to M.Ed./Professional Studies Programs. This group includes applicants who:

- are pursuing an initial teaching license in special education
- hold a graduate-level degree in any academic area at another institution
- have completed a special education licensure program from another institution

Note: All students applying for special education licensure must obtain a separate, additional set of required program application materials. Coursework completed outside the United States

Candidates who completed coursework at a university outside of the United States must submit an English-language transcript evaluation prepared by a professional credential evaluation service, except when the courses appear on a transcript from a U.S. institution. Request a "course-by-course" evaluation report and U.S. bachelor's degree equivalency evaluation. This process can take four to six weeks, so please plan in advance. A suggested provider of this service is Educational Credentials Evaluators (ECE) at P.O. Box 514070, Milwaukee, WI 53203-3470 (414-289-3400; fax: 414-289-3411; and on the Web: <http://ece.org>).

Nonnative English speakers

Nonnative English speakers must submit an official score report from the Test of English as a Second Language (TOEFL). Exceptions can be made for applicants who will have completed 16 semester or 24 quarter credits within the past 24 months in residence as a full-time student at an accredited institution of higher learning in the United States before entering the University of Minnesota.

Applicants may also be required to demonstrate spoken English proficiency with an Oral Proficiency Interview (OPI) test and/or oral interview with faculty or staff. Contact Student Services for more information.

Application Deadlines

Additional licensure application deadlines vary by program, as listed in the following text:

Counseling and student personnel psychology (CSPP)

June 1 for fall term admission; November 1 for spring term admission

K-12 reading

Applications are accepted at any time throughout the year and reviewed on an ongoing basis for summer program admission. March 1 is the deadline for preferred admission, but applications will be accepted after this deadline and cohort openings filled as space allows.

Special education

March 1 for summer or fall enrollment; this program admits students only once a year.

The college reviews applications for the remaining additional licensure programs on an ongoing basis. Submission deadlines for each academic term are listed below:

- Summer session admission—**February 1**
- Fall term admission—**June 1**
- Spring term admission—**October 1**

Submission of Application Package

1. Submit all application materials in a single envelope. Indicate on the envelope the program to which you are applying (e.g., additional licensure: mathematics education).
2. Keep a copy of all application materials you submit.
3. Submit official transcripts in an envelope sealed by the issuing school.

All applicants will receive written notification of the admission committee's final decision. Notification letters are typically mailed within six to eight weeks after the application deadline.
