1. See individual scholarship descriptions. Minimum grade point average (GPA) for consideration for most academic scholarships at the M.Ed. level is 3.00.
2. Scholarships require that students remain enrolled full time and continue to make good academic progress for the period of funding.
3. Students who have **not** received prior CEHD scholarships as M.Ed./initial licensure or M.Ed./professional studies students will be given preference in this review.
4. For scholarships giving preference to low-income students, the review committee will review applicants' financial aid records to confirm eligibility.
