

**M. Ed. / Initial Licensure in Second Languages Education  
 Prerequisite List– Latin DRAFT**

Candidates are required to have an undergraduate degree from an accredited institution with a major in Latin or closely related field, or meet the prerequisites below, and with appropriate liberal arts/general education coursework.

Courses in each of the content areas are required to meet Standard 1 of MNSEPT: “*The learner understands and can create learning experiences that make these aspects of content matter meaningful for students*” (<https://www.revisor.mn.gov/rules/?id=8710.2000>).

Please check with your program area adviser before registering for any prerequisite coursework.
