

Biographical Information

Michael C. Rodriguez

Michael C. Rodriguez, PhD, is dean of the College of Education and Human Development and a professor of educational measurement and assessment. He holds the Campbell Leadership Chair with a focus on education equity and is a member of the University's Academy of Distinguished Teachers. He directs the MN Youth Development Research Group that explores the role of the social and cultural contexts of learning and positive youth development through the measurement of social and emotional learning. He currently chairs the Technical Advisory Group of the National Board of Professional Teaching Standards and is a member of the Design and Analysis Committee of the National Assessment of Educational Progress. He is the recipient of the Albert J. Harris Research Award from the International Literacy Association. Perhaps most importantly, he is a fifth-generation Minnesotan and a first-generation college graduate.

Vice Provost Laurie Van Egeren

As the University of Minnesota's chief public engagement officer, Vice Provost Van Egeren oversees the University's systemwide public engagement agenda. Her portfolio includes the management of the University's Office for Public Engagement,

as well as oversight of its three reporting units: the Center for Community Engaged Learning, Center for Urban and Regional Affairs, and Robert J. Jones Urban Research and Outreach-Engagement Center. Prior to coming to the University in October of 2023, she served as the assistant provost for university-community partnerships and adjunct professor in human development and family studies at Michigan State University (MSU). Recognized as an experienced leader of public and community engagement in higher education and a scholar in the field of public engagement and evaluation methods for community-engaged research, Vice Provost Van Egeren is president of the internationally recognized Engagement Scholarship Consortium and serves on the leadership team of the National Science Foundation-funded Center for Advancing Research Impacts in Society. She holds a doctorate in developmental psychology and a master's degree in child/family clinical psychology from MSU.

Regent Robyn J. Gulley

Robyn Gulley founded New Brookwood Labor College in 2018. The college uses education to address racial, economic, and social imbalances of power. She has organized for LGBTQIA+ rights, built support for the Minnesota health care expansion, organized with homecare workers, and organized support to defeat a constitutional amendment that would have disenfranchised voters. Gulley also educates labor union members and leaders through the Minnesota AFL-CIO. In addition to being an educator, Gulley is working to drive equity and inclusion through local policy; she serves on the West St. Paul City Council and is co-chair of Local Progress Minnesota. Gulley earned a master's of public policy with concentrations in global policy and human rights at the University of Minnesota Humphrey School of Public Affairs.

John Leonard

John Leonard joined the University of Minnesota band faculty in the fall of 2021 after completing his DMA in wind conducting at the University of Kansas. In 2018 he was the interim assistant director of bands, and director of the Bronco Marching Band at Western Michigan University. Previously, Leonard was the assistant director of bands at Northeastern University in Boston, Massachusetts, and worked as an adjunct lecturer at the University of Massachusetts at Amherst, teaching music arranging techniques as well as leading the UMass "Hoop" Band and assisting with the Minuteman Marching Band. A prolific arranger, Leonard writes music for many university marching bands, as well as working on new arrangements and transcriptions for wind band. In the summers, he teaches at the George N. Parks Drum Major Academy where he is both a lead clinician as well as the staff manager for the company.
