Biographical Information

Michael C. Rodriguez

Michael C. Rodriguez, PhD, is dean of the College of Education and Human Development and a professor of educational measurement and assessment. He holds the Campbell Leadership Chair with a focus on education equity and is a member of the University's Academy of Distinguished Teachers. He directs the MN Youth Development Research Group that explores the role of the social and cultural contexts of learning and positive youth development through the measurement of social and emotional learning. He currently chairs the Technical Advisory Group of the National Board of Professional Teaching Standards and is a member of the Design and Analysis Committee of the National Assessment of Educational Progress. He is the recipient of the Albert J. Harris Research Award from the International Literacy Association. Perhaps most importantly, he is a fifth generation Minnesotan and a first generation college graduate.

Wajd Suliman

Wajd Suliman is a first-generation college student graduating with a degree in business and marketing education with an emphasis in analytics. She has made the dean's list for three consecutive years and is committed to personal and professional growth through challenging and hands-on experiences. Wajd interned at KPMG as a governance risk and compliance intern, where she worked with SAP systems, supported client delivery, and gained hands-on experience in risk analysis. She also

held an IT internship at CSM Corporation, where she played a key role in centralizing company operations and worked cross-functionally with finance, architecture, and marketing teams. Currently, Wajd serves as a Red Bull student marketeer and the Formula 1 lead for her state—a role that allows her to channel her passion for motorsport into dynamic event planning and student outreach. She is also passionate about fitness and is currently training for her first HYROX race, which she will be competing in at the end of May in Bangkok, Thailand. She is honored to represent the Class of 2025 at commencement.

John Leonard

John Leonard joined the University of Minnesota band faculty in the fall of 2021 after completing his DMA in wind conducting at the University of Kansas. In 2018 he was the interim assistant director of bands, and director of the Bronco Marching Band at Western Michigan University. Previously, Leonard was the assistant director of bands at Northeastern University in Boston, Massachusetts, and worked as an adjunct lecturer at the University of Massachusetts at Amherst, teaching music arranging techniques as well as leading the UMass “Hoop” Band and assisting with the Minuteman Marching Band. A prolific arranger, Leonard writes music for many university marching bands, as well as working on new arrangements and transcriptions for wind band. In the summers, he teaches at the George N. Parks Drum Major Academy where he is both a lead clinician as well as the staff manager for the company.

Regent Robyn J. Gulley

Robyn Gulley founded New Brookwood Labor College in 2018. The college uses education to address racial, economic, and social imbalances of power. She has organized for LGBTQIA+ rights, built support for the Minnesota health care expansion, organized with homecare workers, and organized support to defeat a constitutional amendment that would have disenfranchised voters. Gulley also educates labor union members and leaders through the Minnesota AFL-CIO. In addition to being an educator, Gulley is working to drive equity and inclusion through local policy; she serves on the West St. Paul City Council and is co-chair of Local Progress Minnesota. Gulley earned a master’s of public policy with concentrations in global policy and human rights at the University of Minnesota Humphrey School of Public Affairs.

Vice Provost Raj Singh

Raj Singh is professor of finance and vice provost and dean of undergraduate education at the University of Minnesota. He has been a member of the faculty at the University of Minnesota since 1999. From 2015-2021 he served as the associate Dean

for Undergraduate Education at the Carlson School of Management. Before that he served for four years as the chair of the department of finance at the Carlson School. He received a BS (mechanical engineering) from Kurukshetra University in 1985, an MBA in information systems from Baruch College at the City University of New York in 1989, an MS in finance from Carnegie Mellon University in 1991, and a PhD in finance also from Carnegie Mellon University in 1995. He has held previous appointments at Washington University at St. Louis (1994-1997), University of Michigan (1997-1999) and Arizona State University (2008-2009). He has published in all the top-tier journals in finance. Some of the topics he has published his research on are mergers and acquisitions, agency theory, market microstructure, initial public offerings, auction models, and municipal bonds. He has presented his research at major conferences in finance and at many prominent universities like MIT, Duke, Yale, Michigan, Michigan State, Washington, Utah, Maryland, Virginia, University of Arizona, Arizona State, Ohio State, American, Claremont, and Hong Kong University of Science and Technology.

Community Engagement Scholars Program

The University of Minnesota award recognizes undergraduate students for outstanding community contributions. To be eligible, students enroll in the Community Engagement Scholars Program (CESP). As participants, students must complete at least eight credits of community-engaged learning coursework, at least 400 hours of community engagement, and six reflections. Scholars also complete an Integrative Community Engagement Project (ICEP) that results in the creation of a sustainable project for a community partner organization.

Bachelor of Science (BS) Degree Candidates

In the following pages, undergraduate candidates are listed in alphabetical order followed by their major, second major, and award designation. College of Education and Human Development degree candidates may graduate with either Latin Honors (Cum, Magna, or Summa Cum Laude) or with distinction (Distinction or High Distinction) or both. These citations are provisional and do not become official until all requirements for the award are fulfilled.

Latin Honors Designations—Students graduating from the College of Education and Human Development through the University Honors Program have taken part in a rigorous course of study, research, scholarship, or other creative work in their major, culminating in an honors thesis representing independent work done under the direction of a faculty supervisor or mentor. Students graduating Cum Laude (with honor) have a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.50 for the last 60 graded credits at the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities (UMTC). Magna Cum Laude (with great honor) awards require a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.66, and Summa Cum Laude (with highest honor) awards require a minimum cumulative GPA of 3.75 in the final 60 graded credits at UMTC.

Distinction Designations—Students earn graduation “with distinction” or “with high distinction” based on cumulative grade point average at UMTC with at least 60 graded credits completed at UMTC. Students graduating “with distinction” must have earned a cumulative GPA of 3.75 or higher in UMTC coursework at the time of graduation; students graduating “with high distinction” must have earned a cumulative GPA of 3.90 or higher in UMTC coursework at the time of graduation.

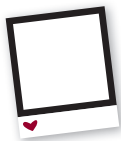
